
Contemplating our bodies and the borders between us, geographically, physically, spiritually, *The Once and Future* is meant as a sensuous proposal to the ways humanity can be, and the ways by which we can learn new ways of being - finding kinships and intimacies between ourselves and our non-human peers.


Through cinema, through music, through lasers, through performance, the work explores the visceral nature of multidisciplinary performance, capturing an essential element of living and existing together. Over the course of 75 minutes, we see a kaleidoscopic impression of life on Earth, interpreted simultaneously by ourselves as audience and a 'higher power' Al system performed by a novel laser tracking choreography.
